NOVSCJanuar Update

Electrical safety is every bit as important at home as it is in the workplace, especially as children are easily exposed to this unseen hazard. Parents must remain vigilant in identifying potential hazards so that risks can be minimized. One problem encountered particularly in older homes is the lack of Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCIs). These devices detect undesirable currents in an electrical circuit and automatically disconnect power to that

circuit.

Electrocution is the cause of approximately 10 percent of industrial fatalities and scores of home injuries/fatalities. Many of these casualties could be eliminated with the use of GFCIs. GFCIs should be tested periodically to determine they are working properly. If you find a GFCI not working properly, have a gualified technician diagnose and correct the problem.
